

**Assistant/Associate Professor in Educational Leadership

The Graduate School of Education and Counseling at Lewis & Clark in Portland, Oregon, offers a full-time, 1.0 FTE, renewable annual appointment as assistant or associate professor with term (non-tenure-track), in the Educational Leadership Department. The appointment begins fall semester of 2013. The Educational Leadership Department consists of the Educational Administration Program, School Counseling Program, and the Educational Leadership Doctoral Program. This position involves substantial teaching and student advising responsibilities in the Educational Administration Program, with an opportunity to teach in the doctoral program. This faculty member will also engage in program development, accreditation activity, and service to the institution.

The faculty member in this position will play a critical role in the continuous improvement of graduate and administrative license programs and in defining the successful educational leader now and for the future. We are looking for an energetic, promising practitioner-scholar with the training and expertise to contribute to an innovative, equity-oriented leadership preparation program that partners closely with local school districts to prepare aspiring administrators and teacher-leaders.

Required qualifications:

- Successful licensed experience working in PK-12 administration
- The ability to teach a variety of courses in educational leadership and administration
- Excellent interpersonal skills and demonstrated capacity to work effectively and collaboratively with university faculty, graduate students, staff, and with faculty, administrators, students, and families from local education agencies and community organizations
- High level of cultural competence that includes understanding the significance and implications of changing demographics in education and issues related to race, class, gender, and sexual orientation
- Experience with a wide variety of instructional and administrative technologies
- Strong written and analytical skills

Preferred qualifications:

- An earned doctorate in Educational Leadership, Educational Administration, or a closely related field; ABD considered if near completion by time of appointment
- Knowledge of and experience with administrator preparation programs
- Experience working with diverse populations
- Experience developing networks and partnerships with schools, communities, and agencies
- Successful higher education teaching experience and/or experience in professional development settings
- Ability to serve on dissertation committees for doctoral students in educational leadership
