In 2011, 40% of the reports of possible abuse that were substantiated by Adult Protective Services involved financial exploitation and 30% involved physical abuse or neglect. Unfortunately, prosecution of such crimes is very limited and it is important for attorneys who represent vulnerable adults to be aware of these problems and learn how to address them properly.
