## Background

Sid Lezak was one of the longest serving US Attorney in the history of the United States, the father of alternative dispute resolution in Oregon, an activist, a community servant, and a mentor to many Oregonians. These summer stipends are designed to honor his legacy by encouraging law students to serve the Oregon community and by providing mentorship and guidance to these students. Through the Lezak Legacy Stipends, the insight, guidance, and encouragement that Sid provided to so many of Oregon's greatest citizens will pass to a new generation.

This Application is for a Lezak Legacy Stipend for summer 2013. There will be four (4) stipends of up to \$5,000 awarded to Lewis & Clark Law students who will be returning to Lewis & Clark in the fall. Recipients are required to complete at least 350 hours of work with their host during the summer and are required to meet with their individual mentor arranged by the Lezak Legacy Committee and participate in mentor events organized by the Lezak Legacy Committee during the summer.

Recipients may augment stipends and salaries from other sources with Lezak Legacy Stipends. Hosts must be non-profit organizations, government offices, or tribal entities and must be located in full or in part within the state of Oregon. The work performed must significantly utilize the student's skills and knowledge gained as a law student; however, the work need not directly connect to legal representation. The Lezak Legacy Committee will select recipients from the applications received.
