

Process schedule confirmed with target dates and meetings identified (see Michael Sestric's June 1, 2004 project schedule: TempletonSummerSchedule.mpp)

First Floor

Givens:

- Health Service Center remains the same (but may benefit from internal remodel?)
- CSAW vacates first floor (moves to Albany) and Student Financial Services moves in
- Cashier remains as is (but may benefit from internal remodel)
- Registrar remains as is

Options for Student Financial Services space:

- 1. HR moves in
- 2. Events Management, Student Activities, Events, College Outdoors or Community Services or some combination move in
- 3. Dean of Students moves in

Service (at the load ing dock) problems need to be addressed: access, staging, separate clean / dirty waste, recycling

Second Floor

Givens:

- Mail Room remains as is (unless concept warrants re-location)
- Bookstore remains as is
- Council Chamber remains as is
- Bathrooms, elevators, mechanical, etc. remain as is (typical of all floors)
- Half of existing computer lab need remains (total, 15-20 computers)
- Relocate offices from under Council Chambers. Use space for storage

Trail Room / Food Service Options (Note: Jeff Rott has contacted Kalberer to begin review of food service facilities. Their tour scheduled for 6/17)

- 1. Cosmetic upgrades
- 2. Removed (function relocated upstairs). Space could be:
 - □ Student lounge
 - □ Co-Op
 - Student meeting space
 - Student offices
 - Other or combination

Other Issues:

- Entrance at Mail Room is awkward
- Remainder of floor is open for re-allocation
- College Outdoors needs storefront? Should be near mail room/student lounge or food service or near atrium with boulder climbing in atrium
- Open stairs can move
- Stairs at Mail Room are a hazard
- Student clubs need more visibility
- Res Life could move to lower level of Tamarack or portable dance floor there?
- Trail Room could become like Rusty Nail

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Third Floor

- Bon Appetite office space is awkward but needs to maintain access to students and kitchen
- Kitchen won't expand its space
- Need Information Desk
- Need space for registration tables (or on Second Floor?)
- Outdoor seating on top of Bookstore roof?

Entries

- Should be multiple "main" entries focus on 2 or 3 locations
- Entrance at Mail Room is awkward
- Copeland entrance is main south entrance now

Student Co-Op

Thayer Lounge not welcoming – feels institutional Need cohesive place for student body to hang out together Ideas for Co-Op

- Forum for free-trade, green building
- Book swap
- Student-run coffee shop with art displays, student radio station plugged in Reed is a good model
- More neutral space less territorial, less clique-ish
- Sell student music
- Visible to other functions
- Performance space next door

Atrium Ideas

- Cover with skylight
- Cover and extend skylight to main entrance
- · Maintain as open space but increase accessibility
- Extend open space to main entrance
- Incorporate as larger Tree Walk on campus
- Extend lounge seating into it

Events Issues / Comments / Ideas

- There is a high demand for spaces like STAM
- Put all meetings rooms in one place: Extend meeting rooms to West of STAM to connect to Council Chambers
- Need better sound barrier at north wall on East STAM, adjacent to kitchen
