

**Assistant Professor in Media Studies:** Lewis & Clark College, a private liberal arts college with 2,000 undergraduates, invites applications for a tenure-track assistant professor position in the Department of Rhetoric & Media Studies, beginning fall of 2016. Preferred teaching fields should complement that of our faculty and might include areas such as new media, big data, gaming, video production, television, gender or race in media, and/or international media. A candidate whose teaching and research connect rhetoric and media will be especially desirable as will candidates who could teach a 200-level empirical research methods course. Teaching responsibilities include Introduction to Rhetoric & Media Studies and Media Theory as well as courses in the candidate's media-related areas of expertise. Ph.D. is required at the time of appointment as a tenure-track member of the faculty. Potential for excellent teaching and research at an undergraduate institution are essential; collaboration with students in research or creative work, and supervision of internships or civic engagement are also encouraged. Usual load is five courses per academic year and may include regular participation in the College's general education program. The College is committed to preparing students for leadership in an increasingly interdependent world, and affirms the educational benefits of diversity. A complete application must include: (1) cover letter of application which includes statements of research interests and teaching experience, as well as a description of how the applicant's teaching and/or work in the campus community will contribute to a culture of inclusion and campus diversity; (2) curriculum vitae; (3) statement of teaching philosophy and evidence of teaching effectiveness; (4) sample of scholarship (published articles, and/or works in progress); (5) graduate transcripts; (6) three letters of recommendation (uploaded separately by the referees).
