

Assistant Professor of Spanish/Hispanic Studies: The Lewis & Clark College Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures invites applications for a tenure-track assistant professorship in our Spanish/Hispanic Studies program beginning Fall 2016. Ph.D. required at the time of appointment. Native or near-native fluency in both Spanish and English. Primary research field should be in Latin American literature and culture. Special consideration will be given to scholars focusing on Mexico, Latino Studies, or Transatlantic Studies. Ability and willingness to teach all levels of Spanish language and literature a must. Potential for excellent teaching and research at an undergraduate institution are essential. Usual load is five courses per academic year and may include regular participation in the College's general education program.

Review of applications will begin on November 2, 2015, and continue until the position is filled. Preliminary interviews will be conducted at the MLA conference in Austin, TX, January 7-10, 2016. A complete application must include:

- (1) cover letter of application which includes statements of research interests, teaching philosophy and experience, as well as a description of how the applicant's teaching and/or work in the campus community will contribute to a culture of inclusion and campus diversity
- (2) curriculum vitae
- (3) evidence of teaching effectiveness
- (4) sample of scholarship
- (5) graduate transcripts
- (6) three letters of recommendation (uploaded separately by the referees)
