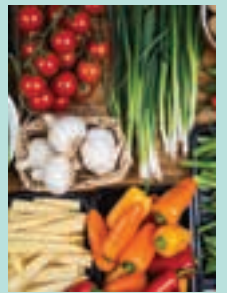
U.S. Senator Heidi Heitkamp
