Chris - Call to Order

President's Report – Chris Ohman '77

Board of Trustees meeting recap from May

As a whole, there is a great sense of movement and momentum throughout the three Schools (CAS the GSEC and the LAW).

■ Leadership transition

The Transition (Wim to Robin) feels seamless. Wim is stepping away appropriately and Robin is stepping up. Robin will assume the presidency in July 2022, following the retirement of President Wim Wiewel.

Stacy Thompson – Also in agreement with Chris's opinion that both Wim and Robin are very clear on next steps and are working together with cohesion and grace.

■ National Student Affairs Leader Selected as Vice President for Student Life

Dr. Evette Castillo Clark will become the vice president of student life effective August 1.

Chris shares thoughts about two campus events, which are strong examples of who we are and who we must be. We must be folks who can take controversy, difficulty and challenging topics and welcome them so that we can come to a better understanding.

• Community Dialogue 1: The Meaning of Lewis and Clark and Community Dialogue in Action

This two-part event in April was the first of a series of LC community dialogues about challenging topics. Chris feels the important part of this dialogue and discussion was about seeking to understand, and then to find common ground and be rooted in facts.

o Monica Lewinsky invited to speak at LC

The L&C Feminist Student Union invited Monica Lewinsky BS '95 to speak on campus on April 20. Her talk was titled "An Evening With Monica Lewinsky: Social Activism, the Price of Shame, and Resilience" Chris was very glad that the College brought her back and embraced her and her story.

■ Enrollment

CAS applications are up strongly from last year where they were also at a high level. The Yield rate is up sharply, which is critical and certainly is promising. In addition, so far the revenue per student is stronger than it has been in the past.

Law School Applications are down but the quality of those applications are up. The placement rate of our graduates is up and strong.

Graduate School counseling programs are strong with still a great deal of interest. Where we see lower numbers is the Masters in Counseling and Masters in Education.

■ Campus Construction

Many capital projects are underway with visible improvements. New tennis dome is up; new roof on the chapel is in progress; as well as Templeton, which will be our new student center welcoming students with brighter and more open spaces, updated lighting, a pedestrian corridor, outside seating, courtyard improvements, and a new exterior elevator.

On the graduate campus, the lower floors of the Corbet house are being renovated for use along with the entrance. Additional parking coming this fall in the South Campus Gravel lot (82 new spaces).

Lewis & Clark is raising funds to transform our existing Joe Huston Memorial Sports Complex into a state-of the-art facility that is among the best in the Northwest Conference. Houston Sport Complex Renovation has received a 500 thousand dollar match donation from a trustee to help complete the renovation.

Chris had the privilege of attending on stage the May CAS graduation ceremony and he was grateful to be a part of the celebration.

<u>Fundraising, Liaison – Edgard Garcia '92 and Stephen LeBoutillier '00</u> (Report **CAS Fundraising Update June 2022**, PDF provided to members via website)

Edgard – We had an aMAYzing end of the month with the Philanthropy Councils fundraising outreach. We are one board member short of 100% giving this year. Board of Alumni Giving - 95% Participation (21 out of 22 donors).

Stephen – We made all our CAS fundraising goals.

- \$15,178,849 in Total Gifts | Goal \$15M CAS: \$9.9M LAW: \$4.1M GSEC: \$856K
- \$2,317,533 in Annual Fund | Goal \$2.3M
 LAW: \$319,353 | Goal \$300K GSEC: \$46,933 | Goal \$43K

<u>Athletics, Liaison – Aron Phillips '92</u>

The Board of Trustees approved moving forward with the Huston Sports Complex renovation at their February meeting. This is the first major capital improvement for the athletics department in a decade.

- Strengthening our baseball and softball programs.(new turf)
- Expanding our varsity sports to include men's soccer and women's lacrosse.
- Honoring the late Jerry Gatto, winningest coach (baseball) in school history.
- Jack Thomson (third baseman) was named an All-American, the programs first since 1992.
- Olivia Brackin (first baseman, softball) and Alyssa Abe (pitcher, softball) both earned spots on the All-NW conference Second Team.
- Men's tennis star Kristian Peev earned All-NW Conference First Team honors for the first time in his career.
- Women's tennis stars Rachael Rice and Caren Uribe were both named to all-NW Conference Second Team. Rice earned the award for the third time in a row.
- Women's basketball star Delsie Johnson earned All-NW Conference First Team honors.
- Women's golf star Kamtyn Ford earned a place on the All-NW Conference Second Team for the third-straight season.

New Coaches:

Golf (Brad Johnson), Volleyball (Erin Labasan), Football (Joe Bushman), as Jay Locey retired in Feb. Bushman was previously offensive coordinator.
