2011-12 Conditions of Regular Admission

Tuition Deposit

A tuition deposit of \$300 is required from all students who intend to enroll at Lewis & Clark College. **The post-mark deadline for this deposit and the enclosed Admitted Student Reply Form is Monday, May 2, 2011.** The Admitted Student Reply Form is also available online at go.lclark.edu/welcometolc. The tuition deposit is nonrefundable.

Once your deposit is sent, you should withdraw from other colleges, perhaps allowing them to offer a spot to someone on their waitlist.

Financial Assistance

Credit for Prior Coursework and/or Examinations

To have any college coursework taken while in high school evaluated for possible transfer credit, please provide the following: (1) A letter from your high school stating that the college work (specified by course) was **not** required for high school graduation and (2) an official transcript from the college that shows the credit granted for the course.

To receive credit for Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) examination results, please send an official report directly to the Office of the Registrar (MSC 108). See the online catalog for specific department policies.

Final Transcript

First-Year Students

All entering first-year students must request that an official copy of their final high school transcript showing date of graduation be sent to the Office of Admissions. This transcript is required before financial aid can be awarded on a continuing basis.

Transfer Students

Transfer students must request that their official, updated transcripts be sent directly to the Office of Admissions if any additional college work has been completed since admission to Lewis & Clark. An updated evaluation of transfer credit will be mailed prior to enrollment.

All Students

Your admission to Lewis & Clark is contingent upon satisfactory completion of all coursework for the current academic year at your current level of performance.
