
Honoring President John R. Howard







Pricing and Registration

Each Reunion Weekend event is affordably priced, and lower prices for certain events are available for attendees aged 17 or under.

For detailed pricing information and to register, visit go.lclark.edu/college/reunions/registration or refer to the enclosed registration form. You are also welcome to register in person at the Alumni Gatehouse any weekday between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m.

On-Campus Housing

You can reserve your housing when you register at go.lclark.edu/college/reunions/registration. We will try to place you next to your classmates in residence halls and you will receive your building and room confirmation prior to your arrival on campus.

The deadline to reserve on-campus housing is May 27.

There are two types of housing available on campus: residence halls and apartments.

- Residence halls feature a shared sleeping space with twin beds for two people or bunk beds for four people and a shared bathroom for each floor. These rooms are available at a cost of \$25 per person, per night.
- Apartments feature private bedrooms with one twin bed in each room and a shared bathroom, kitchen (cooking utensils are not included), and living area for each apartment. These rooms are available at a cost of \$45 per person, per night.

Both types of housing include common lounge areas where you can relax and spend time with friends.

There are no age restrictions for staying on campus. However, we are unable to provide any special equipment, such as cribs, and it is the parents' responsibility to supervise their children while staying on campus.

Most on-campus buildings and apartment halls are wheelchair accessible. If you require any special accommodations, let us know.


Sorry, no pets are allowed in the residence halls or apartments.

Transportation and Parking

Parking on campus will be free for the duration of Reunion Weekend. Additionally, a free Reunion Weekend shuttle will run from Downtown Portland to campus beginning Friday afternoon and continuing through Sunday evening.
