A Resolution Regarding Support of Discontinuing Lawn Watering at Lewis & Clark College

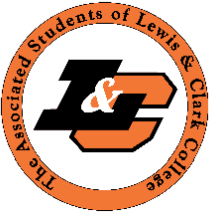
- 1 **Whereas**, discontinuing lawn watering may attract more students because the

- 7 rains unique to the Pacific Northwest.

- 9 ridding the campus of invasive species.

- 4 of the buildings if a record is made of their access, and
- 5 **Whereas**, space is often limited in the library over the weekend, especially for
- 6 group work, and
- 7 **Whereas**, Campus Safety is alone in having the means and opportunity to open
- 8 buildings for students, therefore
- 9 **Be it resolved by the Senate of the Associated Students of Lewis & Clark here**
- 10 **assembled** that students shall be allowed entry to classroom building and labs on
- 11 campus over the weekend, by Campus Safety, regardless of their professors
- 12 informing Campus Safety of this need.

- 2 African studies professor in the history department and the recent addition of Tim
- 3 Mechlinski, a Sociology/Anthropology professor with a specialty in Africa, and
- 4 **Whereas**, the senators still take issue with the lack of a permanent African studies
- 5 history chair on the grounds that it is failing to provide students of Lewis & Clark
- 6 with a balanced choice of study, and
- 7 **Whereas**, the students of ASLC understand that the economy and specifically our
- 8 schools financial situation is tenuous, thus hiring new permanent professors is
- 9 unlikely, therefore
- 10 **Be it resolved by the Senate of the Associated Students of Lewis & Clark here**
- 11 **assembled** that we are acutely aware of these deficiencies in our undergraduate
- 12 education and demand the administration to make the changes now so that we may
- 13 enjoy them before we become alumni.

Whereas, group leaders learn invaluable skills such as democratic meeting processes and proposal writing, and

Whereas, precedents already exist of students receiving credit for their extra-curricular activities in Piolog, and

Whereas, extra-curricular activities often mimic courses Lewis & Clark students already receive credit for, such as accapella groups compared to school choirs, therefore

Be it resolved by the Senate of the Associated Students of Lewis & Clark here assembled that the student government supports beginning discussions with administration and faculty about allowing students to gain academic credit for a wider array of student extra-curricular activities.

Senate Resolution No. SR015

A Resolution Regarding The Inclusion of More Students in ASLC Senate

- 1 **Whereas, Whereas** the primary reason for student senate is to empower students
- 2 by giving them a voice in the school's affairs, and,
- 3 **Whereas** students who transfer and want to be involved in student government
- 4 may not know enough students to get the required number of signatures and,
- 5 **Whereas** at the beginning of the year students often are unsure of their schedule
- 6 and therefore unable to commit to a permanent, year long activity, and,
- 7 **Whereas** students who are ineligible may desire to be involved in senate after their
- 8 probation is lifted and this may be a considerable amount of time before the
- 9 academic year ends, and,
- 10 **Whereas** the motivation behind creating senate was to encourage student to
- 11 become more involved in their schools affairs, and,
- 12 **Whereas** the current configuration of senate is such that each class is represented
- 13 by only three voting senators, and,
- 14 **Whereas** Lewis & Clark's scale enables more direct participation in democracy;
- 15 **Be it resolved by the Senate of the Associated Students of Lewis & Clark here**
- 16 **assembled** that if a student comes to senate meetings for three consecutive weeks,
- 17 the student will be granted a vote on the third time and after that the same rules that
- 18 apply to senators that require attendance will also apply to these students in that to
- 19 keep their vote they must continue to attend.
