Accompanying the paintings will be Waterston's most recent project based on the life of St. Francis of Assisi. <i>The Flowering (The Fourfold Sense)</i> is a portfolio of 13 hand-colored prints by Waterston and 13 broadsides written by Tyrus Miller, professor of modern European literature at the University of California at Santa Cruz. The title, <i>The Flowering</i> , alludes to the Fioretti, or The Little Flowers of St. Francis, the 14th century florilegium account of the saint's life.
