Program Focus:

Language Intensive

Prerequisite Courses:

Previous participation on the Santiago, Dominican Republic program or completion of Spanish 321. A 3.0 GPA in language courses is also required.

Application Deadline:

Program Design:

In cooperation with Council on International Education Exchange (CIEE), Lewis & Clark offers this program at Universidad de Chile and Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile. Students live with host families.

Requirements Fulfilled:

Fulfills the two course international studies and overseas study requirements for the Hispanic Studies major, the Foreign Languages Major with Spanish as primary language, and the requirement for the Latin American Studies minor.

Credits:

4 courses per semester/16 credits

Curriculum:

Following a two-week advanced intensive Spanish language and culture course, students enroll in regular university courses at the host universities, where they can choose from a wide range of

course offerings in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences. A catalog of the courses and course descriptions is available in the Overseas & Off-Campus Programs Office.

Resident Staff:

The Resident Director, Dr. Hector Cruz-Feliciano, has a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and a M.A. from Illinois State University. He served as a Peace Corps volunteer in Guatemala, working with indigenous communities. He has taught at the University of Puerto Rico, Thomas More University in Nicaragua, and the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile. His current research interest is the relationship between neoliberalism and political culture in developing countries. The Resident Director supervises and administers the program. He also assists students with academic, administrative, and day-to-day matters.

The Assistant Resident Director, Mauricio Paredes, assists the Resident Director with administrative and academic duties. Elsa Maxwell is the Resident Coordinator, in charge of managing internships and extracurricular activities. The Housing Coordinator, Briggitta Muñoz, handles housing and office administration.
