Tuition and Fees

Lewis & Clark determines tuition and fees for the year each spring. Tuition charges for the summer 2015 through spring 2016 sessions are as follows:

Financial Assistance

If you plan to apply for financial aid, you should do so at the same time you apply for admission. Although no financial aid award will be made until after you are admitted, you should not wait until you are admitted before beginning your application for financial aid. For priority consideration, you must complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by February 1. You may complete the FAFSA online at fafsa.ed.gov. Lewis & Clark's code is 003197.

Scholarships and Grants

Transfer of Credit

We evaluate the transfer of graduate credit from other institutions on an individual basis. A maximum of 10 credits may be transferred into the graduate school. Only graduate-level credit you have earned in the five years prior to admission and not used toward the requirements of a previously awarded degree will be considered for transfer credit. The amount that may be transferred for each program is determined by the program faculty.

International Students

Lewis & Clark welcomes applications from international students. International students must follow the application instructions of the program they wish to enter. In addition, students must provide official translated and evaluated transcripts, proof of English proficiency, and proof of adequate financial support during their time of study in the United States.
