The department of Counseling Psychology in the Graduate School of Education and Counseling at Lewis and Clark College invites applications for a full-time assistant or associate tenure-track faculty appointment beginning in September, 2016. We seek applicants who have a family and couple therapy training background, knowledge of COAMFTE accreditation standards, commitment to teaching and developing social equity within and outside the program, demonstrated potential for scholarly productivity, and ability to work collaboratively with program and graduate school faculty.

The department offers M.A. and M.S. degrees in Marriage, Couple and Family Therapy (MCFT). The program offers four optional tracks in Addictions, International Family Therapy, Ecopsychology, and Sex Therapy. We aim to provide an integrated training curriculum focusing on systemic/ecological practices grounded in the values of diversity, social equity and global citizenship.

Qualifications

- Ph.D. in MFT or closely related field
- Oregon-licensed MFT or equivalent
- AAMFT Approved supervisor/supervisor-in-training or supervisor eligible
- Specialization in systemic/social constructionist therapies with a focus on the family-larger systems intersection
- Commitment to developing critical and decolonial approaches to family therapy and family therapy training
- Significant clinical experience and teaching at the graduate level
- Productive research agenda with evidence of scholarly publication
- Experience with children/adolescents, addictions, and community outreach preferred

Responsibilities

- Teach graduate courses in Couple and Family Therapy
- Provide supervision to students in practicum and internship at the L&C Community Counseling Center and other community-based placement sites
- Help implement social justice approach in clinical training
- Plan, coordinate and implement clinical training and placements in collaboration with peers and staff
- Develop scholarly agenda
- Collaborate on curriculum and program development, serve on various departmental and school-wide committees, participate in professional development activities and community service, advocate for the MCFT profession

- Participate in program assessment and accreditation
- Assume responsibility for program administration as needed
