

### **Clinical Faculty (Practicum Supervisors) for Secondary English Language Arts**

Lewis & Clark College Graduate School of Education and Counseling invites applications for several positions of Clinic Faculty (Practicum Supervisor) for the Secondary English Language Arts MAT program to begin immediately and continue until June 2017. Typically Clinical Faculty (Supervisors) work with two or three teacher candidates.

#### **Responsibilities include:**

- Providing support for each ELA teacher candidate's practicum teaching
- Completing at least six practicum classroom observations at each ELA teacher candidate's practicum site
- Providing a brief written report for each observation
- Conducting two triad meetings with each ELA candidate and practicum site mentor (one in March and one in late May or early June)
- Checking in with the mentor teacher during or after each classroom observation to determine how the teacher candidate is doing
- Completing a formative and summative evaluation of each ELA candidate using the Teacher Candidate Assessment
- Writing a letter of recommendation for each ELA candidate
- Participating in professional development meetings over the academic year (currently one is scheduled for March)

#### **Requirements:**

High School teaching experience in English Language Arts, five or more years preferred  
Hold or be eligible for an Oregon Teaching License with an endorsement in English Language Arts
