



During the fall and spring semesters, there is a parking fee, Monday - Fridays 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Follow this <u>link to register your vehicle for parking</u>. Parking can be crowded, so we encourage you to take public transportation and/or the free <u>Pioneer Shuttle Bus</u>, which is available fall and spring semesters only.

- If you use TriMet (buses and rail), you can get a student discount (up to 75% discount!) if you purchase it through the <u>transportation portal</u>. Learn how to get a discounted <u>TriMet</u> pass as a Lewis & Clark student.
- TriMet Bus Service to the Campus The #39 bus route runs between the Campus, the
 Burlingame transit center, and Safeway on SW Barbur Boulevard, and the Hillsdale
 neighborhood. The connecting bus routes at the Burlingame Transit Center are numbers
 1, 12, 64, and 94. The Connecting routes in Hillsdale are numbers 44, 45, 54, 55, 56,
 61, and 64.

What to Pack

If you are here September through May, bring clothes for winter. If you are here for the summer only, bring a light jacket or sweater as well as warm weather clothes. Rain jackets are a must for most seasons. Temperatures range from:

Summer sessions: 24°C to 37°C

Fall Semester: 27°C-1°C Spring Semester: 1°C-11°C

Students wear informal, casual clothes. Most students wear blue jeans to class. You may want to bring traditional national clothing from your country to wear at the International Fair in March, or on special occasions.

Bring posters or pictures from your country that will help decorate your room and remind you of home. If you like to cook, you may also want to bring a cookbook, some special spices, and coffee or tea from your country. The residence halls have small kitchens where you can prepare simple dishes.
